## BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

#### MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

As we look back on the last 8 months of the year and look forward to the next 4 months, it is safe to say that 2020 will go down as a very unusual year in the history of Hy-Tech. The rapid onset of the COVID-19 pandemic in North America in early 2020 has had a devastating effect on many businesses and has impacted many lives. We have not been immune to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic at Hy-Tech but, throughout 2020 we have been successfully working through the operational challenges brought on by the pandemic.

The year began with a fairly typical start. We had a steady ramp-up to 20 drills in the 1st quarter of 2020, operating in 4 countries, and producing approximately 23,000 meters/month. Drilling production changed dramatically in the early 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter with the onset of the COVID pandemic. Within a few weeks all international and domestic operations came to an abrupt halt by mid-March, apart from 4 drills operating at the Red Chris mine. Our drilling production was reduced to 5,000 meters/ month and our revenue from drilling operations plummeted. At the time, very little was known about the virus. The economy was shutting down and we had no idea when we would be returning to work. During the next few months, our Management team worked together to develop health and safety protocols and procedures to ensure our employees were protected. We prepared a financial plan to ensure there was long-term funding available to support the company through an extended period without revenue from drilling, and we continued to prepare our equipment for a return to work. As in previous years when experiencing a downturn in drilling activity, we used this time to prepare for the next turnaround in the market.

Our field operations did not begin to return to normal levels in Canada until early July which was brought on by an unexpected bull market in precious metals. Gold prices began to rise sharply in the late 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter and in July topped US\$2,000 per ounce for the first time in history. Silver prices continued to rise to over US\$26 per ounce, an increase of more than 60% over prices last year. The surge in precious metal prices led to a substantial increase in drilling activity. At the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> guarter we began ramping up our domestic operations and by the early 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter we had 30 drills in operation. It seems that some of our clients in Canada have expanded their drilling programs because of improving market conditions and other clients are trying to make up for drilling that was not completed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter. It is shaping up to be a busy 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> quarter for Hy-Tech which will help to offset some of the effects that the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter shutdown has had on our operations. International operations will be slower to recover. We currently have 2 drills operating in Alaska and 1 underground drill in Spain. Unfortunately, there is no indication that we will be returning to work in Portugal or Sweden in 2020.

In our strategic planning efforts, we will continue to target the Mine Developers and the Major and Mid-tier mining companies to access larger drilling programs at their operations. As we continue our pursuit of these companies, we will need to ensure that we are adequately prepared to meet all their requirements.

## OPERATIONS

Summer exploration programs are now in full swing with work underway with Seabridge, Pure Gold, Barkerville, Pretivm, HighGold and GT Gold. This work is in addition to the ongoing programs running at Red Chris, Brucejack and Barkerville.

Newmont has cut budgets, so Hy-Tech has finished drilling at Musselwhite. MATSA in Spain is back to normal operations with the remainder of Europe still on hold due to uncertainty around COVID-19. On a positive note, the program at Red Chris was expanded to 8 drills that are expected to turn to the end of the year. All indications are that our clients are eager to make up for delays due to COVID-19.






## THANK YOU, IAN MOORE - FOR 18 YEARS OF SERVICE AT HY-TECH


